


I am learning about the picture glossary of a nonfiction book.

I will look at the picture glossary in a book. I will be able to tell others where it is found, or located, and what job it does. I will use the picture glossary to find words in the book.




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Fiction and Nonfiction

Fiction means made up or invented. The ideas are not true, but come from a person's imagination.

Nonfiction means true or factual. The ideas are not made up. The information is correct or accurate.



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Picture Glossary

A picture glossary is a special page in a book which shows readers a picture of a word in the book.

A picture glossary might be right at the start or right at the end of a book.
