

I am learning to infer, or figure out, the meanings of words I don't know.



Success Criteria


I will find, or identify, words I don't understand. I will try to work out a word's meaning by:

<u>Inferring</u>

Inferring means to figure something out without being told. Great readers infer by looking for clues in the words and pictures and connecting these with what they already know.

Word Meanings


- 1.Look at the pictures.
- 2.Read around the word and think, "What would make sense?"
- 3.Swap the word for another word and think, "Does that make sense?"
- 4.Look for a comma and check whether it is followed by the meaning of the word.
- 5.Look for a word that means the opposite.

6.Think about what parts of the word mean. For example, dogs = dog + s = more than one dog.
