
Learning Intention I am learning to identify or work out the mood, or way a story makes me feel.




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Success Criteria

Mood

The mood is the atmosphere, or tone. The author creates the mood by choosing words or pictures which give readers a feeling, like being excited about a ride or creeped out by a dark place. The way something is described creates the mood. Adjectives are important when creating the mood. To work out the mood, ask, "How does this make me feel?"


