
Learning Intention I am learning to anticipate, or predict some outcomes, or things that might happen.

<u>Success Criteria</u> I will use my knowledge of cause and effect to give suggestions about what I think might happen in a story.




Making Judgments A judgment is an opinion that is formed by thinking carefully about something and deciding whether you think it is right or wrong.

When skilful readers make judgments, they notice what is being said or done. This is called evidence.

They use evidence to justify or give reasons for their thinking.
